






We have had members wait until they were at the mouth of the river to call and say they were returning early.

PORT WELLER RACE/RALLY


Saturday, June 2nd is our annual Port Weller Race. Check our club web sight for the Notice Of Race and Sailing Instructions.

Come One, Come All! First BBQ is Wednesday, May 29


at the A-frame at 6:30 p.m.




in new boats as availability allows.

PHRF LO Update

I'd like to introduce myself, my name is Larry Huibers and I am the new handicapper for NOLSC as well as the District Handicapper.

There have been a few changes this year and some ratings have been adjusted by Central Council. There is a very detailed newsletter available on line at PHRF LO, please have a read. It talks about changes that have happened to how boat's certificates are calculated. PHRF LO tries very hard to provide clear and open communication and the newsletter is a great tool. As well, all active certificates are viewable on line. If you haven't checked out their site, have a look.

Please note that we need all boats wishing to get scored to hold an accurate and current rating certificate. The process is pretty straight forward if you had a certificate from last year. If no changes have been made to the boat and you haven't changed your largest head sail, spinnaker or main let both Donna and I know. Once we and you are sure your information is accurate I can endorse the certificate. There are some outliers that need attention and I will be in direct contact with those certificate holders.

There is a \$30 fee for your certificate and Barb will bill you directly since the club is invoiced for all certificates we have, currently in the 38 certificate range. Even if

you race one design you must have a certificate since some racing is mixed fleet like river racing and if you travel to other regattas.

This year we have some new boats and new boat owners, welcome to racing. I will be in contact to assist with getting a certificate. If you do need a certificate you can download the application and begin filling the information you know and I will assist with everything else.

As you know we share racing with YYC and they need to supply our scoring people with current and accurate certificates so we can have their current rating. Jan Styen and Chris Doyle are the Handicappers for YYC, in case you have feet in both camps.


