




See you out there.



Our instructors did a marvelous job, especially in getting the kids on the water every day, even during the challenging weather in July.



Did You Know...

Hawse pipe, hawse-hole or hawse - The shaft or hole in the side of a vessel's bow through which the anchor chain passes.

Binnacle - The stand on which the ship's compass is mounted.

Three sheets to the wind – On a three-masted ship, having the sheets of the three lower courses loose will result in the ship meandering aimlessly downwind. Also, a sailor who has drunk strong spirits beyond his capacity.

Pusser – Purser, the person who buys, stores and sells all stores on board ships, including victuals, rum and tobacco. Originally a private merchant, latterly a warrant officer. Also, in modern use, a term for the Navy in general (pussers) or a sailor in particular (a pusser).




Highlights of Board of Directors Meeting


July 2009







C & C International Cup Winners!



N.O.L.S.C.'s Yogi Bear captured the C&C International Cup this summer at the C&C Owner's Regatta hosted by National Yacht Club. The trophy is given to the boat which has the best cumulative overall corrected time for the entire Spinnaker A course. There were 36 boats competing on "A" Course this year.

Yogi is not the first NOLSC boat to win this trophy. It's previously been won by Bandit, Spirit twice and also Ludo. Yogi's win makes it 5 for NOLSC boats out of 15 years outpacing all other clubs that have

had boats contesting this trophy.

Skipper Larry Bayer says that this speaks highly of the competitive quality of the racing at NOLSC. "Our Wednesday night racing combined with YYC that gives us a large fleet with lots of interaction with various sizes of boats obviously helps hone our racing skills so that we're all very competitive when we do other regatta's The competition here is second to none."
